



## Precautionary Drinking Water Advisory

**This Advisory applies to all residents and users of the  
*SHL Rural Pipeline Association – Muenster Line*  
drinking water system and is effective immediately.**

**Pursuant to clause 32(1)(a) of *The Environmental Management and Protection Act 2002* this Precautionary Drinking Water Advisory is issued as a result of the start-up of the new drinking water distribution system. The safety of the Muenster Line drinking water supply currently does not meet minimum regulatory requirements and, therefore, the safety of the Muenster Line drinking water supply cannot be ensured at all times. Pursuant to Clause 32(1)(b) of *The Environmental Management and Protection Act 2002*, consumers are notified to:**

- (a) boil all water, used for drinking purposes, for at least one (1) minute, at a rolling boil, prior to use;
- (b) boil water to be used for other activities where it may be ingested, including:
  - (i) brushing teeth or soaking false teeth;
  - (ii) washing fruits and vegetables;
  - (iii) food or drink which will not be subsequently heated; and
  - (iv) ice cubes;
- (c) do not drink from any public drinking fountains supplied with water from the public water supply; and
- (d) use an alternative water source known to be safe, if you do not wish to boil the water.

Under most circumstances, residents do not need to boil water used for other household purposes. Adults, adolescents and older children may shower, bathe or wash using tap water but should avoid swallowing the water. Dishes and laundry may be washed in tap water, either by hand or by machine. Residents should also consult with a physician before using the water if they have severe cuts or rashes.

As a result of the new drinking water distribution system being pressurized, the resort village is required to undertake a number of steps to ensure the safety of the water before it can be used by consumers.

This **Precautionary Drinking Water Advisory** is effective immediately and will not be lifted until all conditions of Saskatchewan Environment's waterworks system start-up protocol are met by the SHL Rural Pipeline Association and water quality test results determine the water supply to be completely safe.

Saskatchewan Environment, the Saskatoon Health Region and the SHL Rural Pipeline Association will continue to work together to keep residents advised.
